INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

*MPD and OSHFMC took part in the National Drug Take Back Day on October 28th resulting in over 75 pounds of old or unused prescription drugs being collected. The drugs were then taken to the Illinois State Police Crime Lab where they were secured by the Drug Enforcement Agency.

*No out of the normal incidents were reported during Halloween.

*Chief Switzer and Investigator Hepner participated in the semi-annual Monmouth College Task Force on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault.

*MPD assisted the Warren County Sheriff's Department with the robbery that occurred at the Roseville Bank.

*MPD began investigating the counterfeit \$100 bills that were passed in Monmouth. A suspect has been identified who is not from this area.

STAFF TRAINING:

*Lt. Kinney, Investigator Hepner and Sergeant Blackman attended the Illinois Homicide Investigators Training Conference in Itasca IL. This training conference is part of the continuing training that our Homicide Investigators must attend to keep their State of Illinois certification.

*Investigator Kramer and Lt. Bratcher attended the RAIDER Solo Engagement Instructor Course. Both officers will now be able to instruct the department (first on scene responders) in tactical skills necessary to engage an active shooter in a hostile environment by themselves until more assets arrive on scene.

NON-EMERGENCY ACTIVITIES:

*Investigators McVey, Hepner and Sgt. Blackman received awards from the Illinois MEG Directors and Task Force Commanders Association in recognition of their investigative efforts in a case which focused on a major methamphetamine supplier in both Illinois and Iowa. The officers executed multiple search warrants that led to



the seizure of 7 pounds 10 ounces of methamphetamine along with \$23,151 in US currency. 5 individuals received federal indictments as a result.

*Active Intruder Drills were conducted at Central Intermediate School, United North and Immaculate Conception School.

*Chief Switzer attended the Landlord Association meeting discussing issue related to renters and police involvement in some of the processes landlords often deal with.

*As a follow-up, one of my goals as the newly appointed Police Chief was to improve the communication within the department and coming into the department. MPD administrative staff has been meeting on a weekly basis, and will continue to meet weekly, to communicate any information that is needed for the smooth operation of the department.
