INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

*On April 25th a joint operation involving MPD, WCSD, WCITF and ISP executed search warrants on two residences in Monmouth that were suspected to be used in the trafficking of ICE methamphetamine. This was part of a 3 month investigation of methamphetamine trafficking in Monmouth. A total of 7 individuals were taken into custody.

*An Active Intruder Drill was conducted at MRHS.

*An Active Intruder Drill was conducted at United Jr. High School.

*Chief Switzer attended the area emergency responders meeting coordinated by the Warren County Health Dept.

*MPD took part in the Carl Sandburg College career expo. Several MPD officers and dispatchers attended the event.

*Drug Awareness training was provided to the staff of Central Intermediate School

CURRENT INFORMATION:

*The one-way traffic at Central Intermediate is going well during pick-up times.

*All MPD officers and staff have been trained in the use of NARCAN and it has been deployed with MPD officers. To date, approximately 120 people in Monmouth and Warren County have been trained in the use of NARCAN. MPD will be the central repository for NARCAN (Naloxone) kits

STAFF TRAINING:

*MPD administration has met with the Illinois State Police on overweight truck enforcement. ISP detailed what training is required and information was discussed about MPD starting this type of enforcement around Monmouth. More details will be available in the future. This program may be operational after September of this year.

*MPD officers attended Mental Health Awareness training.



*MPD officers attended Breath Alcohol Operator training.

*Chief Switzer and Lt. Bratcher met with Mobile Training Unit 4 to start using MPD as a distant learning site for training classes. Class will be taught at another location with live feed coming into MPD so officers do not have to travel as much for training.
