### INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

- \*Chief Switzer gave the opening remarks at the Special Olympics Spring Games at Sunnyslane Field
- \*Active Intruder drills were conducted at United Junior High School
- \*MPD officers took part in the Career Day at MR Junior High School
- \*The Down Hill Derby took place on Saturday the 26<sup>th</sup>. Approximately 20 kids took part in the event. Attendance was low but we are hoping for bigger attendance next year

### STAFF TRAINING:

- \*Staff and Supervisory officers went to Internal Affairs and Professional Standards training
- \*Narcan training was completed with all MPD officers now carrying Naloxone Kits
- \*The first distant learning class was held at MPD. The class dealt with Child Exploitation and Investigative Interview Techniques. MPD Investigators were in attendance along with officers from several other agencies. The class was actually presented in E. Moline and was pushed out to MPD via the internet. This was a test run for the distant learning at MPD. MPD is now fully operational as a distant learning site.

### EQUIPMENT RELATED ISSUES:

- \*IPRF Grant monies for MPD were used to purchase 14 outer vest carriers that the officers will begin wearing. The vest carrier will allow officers to insert special threat plates into the vest if needed during an incident. The vest carriers will also allow officers to get some equipment off their duty belt. The vest carriers should start being worn by officers in July.
- \*The new squad car that was budgeted for this year was ordered through Morrow Brothers Ford in Greenfield Illinois. This is the State contract holder for the Ford Interceptor Utility vehicle which was the vehicle ordered. The vehicle is scheduled to arrive in approximately 12 weeks.
