### INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

- \*Drug awareness training was given to teachers and staff at Monmouth-Roseville Jr. High School.
- \*The annual MELC Turkey Trot was conducted without incident.
- \*Chief Switzer attended the Warren County/Monmouth Auxiliary Police meeting. At this meeting Chief Switzer reiterated how important the Auxiliary Police are in helping MPD. Also discussed were some procedural changes that Chief Switzer was instituting for the Auxiliary Police.
- \*MPD will host an intern from Western Illinois University starting in January. Drew Kane came to MPD and spoke with staff in preparation for the internship.
- \*MPD officers patrolled the Christmas on the Square without incident.
- \*Chief Switzer, Lt. Kinney and Lt. Bratcher participated in Freezing For Food.

### STAFF TRAINING:

- \*All MPD officers took part in Mental Health Awareness classes. This is one of many mandated classes by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board. All officers must receive certification for this class.
- \*Three MPD staff went to the Red Cross CPR Instructor Course and were certified.

### EQUIPMENT RELATED ISSUES:

- \*All MPD radar units in the squad cars were certified during November. Certification certificates are produced for each radar unit which will then be used in court if needed for a speeding ticket case.
- \*A new spring had to be put on the North garage door due to internal components of the old spring breaking.
- \*An MPD squad car door received damage from a person who was arrested and was being transported to Mercer Co. Jail. The door was bent back into position and is functional at this time.
