### INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

\*Coordination with MFD and MRHS has begun for the Mock DUI Crash presentation that will be done in April at MRHS.

\*A lengthy residential burglary investigation that began in October of 2019 and involved 6 different residences over a 3 month time period came to a conclusion last week. A search warrant was conducted by MPD and ISP Tactical Unit at 817 S. C St. This search warrant provided valuable evidence for MPD to arrest Randall J. Bell who is charged with the six different Residential Burglaries and Possession of Methamphetamine. An arrest warrant had been issued for Bell. I want to recognize the time and effort our investigators put into this case. Inv. Hepner, Inv. Kramer and Inv. McVey worked on this case on a daily basis. Their hard work and creative investigative skills paid off.

\*Several drug related investigations were conducted over the last month which also resulted in search warrants being conducted at several different locations at the same time. These investigations and search warrants resulted in the arrest of 7 different individuals.

\*ALICE was conducted for three different churches in the Monmouth area.

### STAFF TRAINING:

\*Several years ago the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board issued additional training mandates to all agencies in Illinois. But the State did not provide any type of tracking tool for these additional mandates, most of which have different recertification time frames. We have been working hard to come up with a system that will track each individual officer and when each officer needs to recertify in those areas. MPD does have a system in place now for this.

### EQUIPMENT RELATED ISSUES:

\*The issue that was previously reported with the garage heating source has been corrected. Thanks to Joe Clark, the heat was fixed at a considerably smaller amount than we were advised of.
